#### 1. ATHLETES

The OC invites 4 athletes per NF. They will be provided with a total of 2 double rooms including breakfast in the above event Hotel at OC expense from 5<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> January 2010 (5 nights).

**Please note that this invitation applies only to athletes competing in the FEI World Cup competitions, i. e. classes 4 and 7.**

Additional athletes will stay at the event at their own expense. However, rooms will be offered at a special rate by the event hotel.

Lunch and dinner for all athletes: at the expense of OC from 6<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> at the show ground.

#### GROOMS

Requests for visa and accommodation must be sent with entries.

Accommodation for grooms will be at the cost of OC from 3<sup>rd</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> January 2010.

All meals: at OC expense for entire duration of their stay.

There will be sufficient sanitary and showering facilities, with hot and cold water for **male** grooms close to the stables. These will be regularly maintained in a proper state of cleanliness.

Female grooms will be accommodated at OC expense in a nearby hotel. Please advise OC with your entries if you bring a female groom.

#### 2. HORSES

Transport expenses to be paid by the Athlete. Transfer of horses arriving at any UAE airport will be arranged by OC at their expense. Please send transfer request with entries.

Stabling is free of charge for all participating horses.

For additional horses, stabling can be provided at a cost of AED 1,500 per horse. Please consult with OC as space is limited.

#### 3. WELCOME

The time and date of arrival of athletes and horses and their means of transport must be given to the OC in order to assist them on arrival.

#### 4. LOCAL TRANSPORTATION - ARRANGEMENTS FROM HOTEL TO SHOWGROUNDS

A shuttle service will be available for the duration of the event.

## VI. GENERAL REGULATIONS

### 1. SCHOOLING DURING COMPETITIONS

Athletes wishing to school during speed competitions (Table A and C) must inform the Show Office at the time of declaration, latest 20 minutes before the start of the class. They will start first in these competitions.

### 2. PRACTICE ARENA

From the time of arrival, training (including working, lunging and walking) of horses is only allowed at specified times on the official exercise areas provided by the Organising Committee due to quarantine regulations.

However from Wednesday January 6th, 2010 (immediately after the Horse Inspection) until the conclusion of the event on Saturday all exercise / practice areas will be permanently controlled by FEI stewards.

During a competition the warm-up arena is strictly reserved to horses starting in the present competition and the next three athletes must be mounted and ready to enter the competition arena. If an athlete is not ready when his/her starting number is called, he/she will lose the place in the starting order and he/she will be eliminated from that competition at the discretion of the Ground Jury, unless certain circumstances prevent this (e.g. losing a horse shoe just before his/her turn to start).

### 3. DECLARATIONS

No horse will be allowed to start in more than one competition per day. Every athlete is allowed to compete with one horse only in each competition, except for class no. 4.

Moreover no horse will be permitted to compete in any competition, unless the declaration has been made within the specified times; i.e.:

- a) Horses participating in the competitions on Thursday (January 7th, 2010) must be declared immediately following the Horse Inspection on Wednesday 6th, 2009, but at the latest by 16hrs00 (UAE time) in the Show Office.
- b) Horses starting in the competitions on Friday and Saturday must be declared on the night before at the Show Office, at the latest 30 minutes after the conclusion of the last competition.

After declaration no substitution of horses will be permitted, unless the Event Veterinarian certifies officially, that the declared horse has become unfit to compete since the time of declaration. The final decision about the substitution is however at the discretion of the Ground Jury, after consultation with the Event Veterinarian.

## THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

### FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and **Athletes** must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. **The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**

- The FEI World Cup™ competition is open to the top 25 placed athletes in the Qualifying competition, provided they were not eliminated or retired.

The start order for the first round will be **established according to a draw**.

- If the home country does not have an athlete among the top 25 qualified competitors, the highest placed home-athlete in the qualifying competition may compete in the FEI World Cup™ competition as an extra competitor bringing the starting field to 26. If there is a home athlete among the top 25, the number of athletes in this competition is limited to 25.

- If non Arab League athletes have participated in the Qualifying competition the number of athletes eligible for participation in the FEI World Cup™ competition will be increased until the 25<sup>th</sup> Arab League Athlete is qualified at all times.

- If one or more qualified athlete(s) decide(s) not to participate, the next best placed competitor according to the result of the Qualifying competition may take his place, providing that the competitor concerned has not been eliminated or has retired in the qualifying competition. Such replacements are allowed until two hours before the start of the FEI World Cup™ competition.

- If the best placed competitor, according to the results of the qualifying competition, is a non Arab League Athlete, both this competitor and the next best placed Arab League Athlete will be eligible for participation in the FEI World Cup™ competition.

- Athletes qualified for this competition can participate with the horse of their choice.

- The FEI World Cup™ competition is run according to the following formula :

Over a two round competition with the first round not against the clock and the second round against the clock, Art. 273.3.3. The top 25% of competitors on points from the first round, in any case all clear rounds, qualify for the second round based on their penalties in the first round. Those not qualified for the second round are placed according to their penalties in the first round.

Classification will be according to Art.273.4.3.
